LEOMINSTER'S COMMITMENT TO SAFE WATER: CITY-WIDE SERVICE LINE INVENTORY AND LEAD REMOVAL INITIATIVE

Leominster is conducting a city-wide inventory of water service lines to ensure drinking water safety, complying with the EPA's Lead and Copper Rule Revisions. Funded by a State Revolving Fund grant, the inventory will run through October 2024, identifying materials used in service lines from the water main to properties.

Homes built after 1987, when lead pipes were banned in Massachusetts, are exempt from inspection. For others, the city may request visual inspections to identify any lead or galvanized pipes needing replacement. If lead is detected, homeowners will be notified within 30 days of the inventory's expected completion in November 2024.

GOVERNOR HEALEY ANNOUNCES STATEWIDE MVP GRANT AWARDS

Governor Healey visited Leominster on August 1 to announce the statewide grant awards for the Massachusetts Vulnerability Preparedness

(MVP) Program at Leominster City Hall, with awardees from across the Commonwealth joining the celebration.

More than \$52 million—the largest sum ever granted through the MVP program—was awarded to help communities identify their most significant climate challenges and develop strategies to mitigate the associated risks.

The Massachusetts Vulnerability Preparedness (MVP) Program is a state initiative that provides financial and technical support to cities and towns to help them prepare for and adapt to climate change. The program offers planning grants for assessing climate vulnerabilities and action grants for implementing projects that address risks like flooding, extreme weather, and rising sea levels.

TWIN CITIES RAIL TRAIL ASSOCIATION COMMUNITY CELEBRATION & BIKE RIDE

On August 3, the Healey-Driscoll Administration and local leaders joined the Twin Cities Rail Trail Association and MassDOT to celebrate the completion of the bicycle and pedestrian bridge over Route 2 in Leominster. Now part of the Twin Cities Rail Trail, the bridge is named in honor of the late Congressman John W. Olver, who was pivotal in securing federal funding for the project.

The bridge is also dedicated to Romolo Testarmata, one of the TCRT's trailblazers. The bridge completes phase one of the Twin Cities Rail Trail project, which connects Leominster and Fitchburg. Phase Two is set to begin bidding this fall and will extend the trail further.





The event, made possible by a gift from Leominster Credit Union, included a free yoga class, face painting and refreshments by Roots Natural Foods. A community bike ride followed.


